




Featured Project

For the Steelcase NEXT project, ID V students were challenged to create a co-working office space. The client, NEXT, is a forwardthinking, progressive co-working organization at the forefront of the shift in how people choose to work today. The project was created to help students think of new and innovative ways to meet the needs of today's workers. Because of the change in the way we work – freelance work and small business formation are surging and the trend is only projected to accelerate – the environments we work in are changing too. People don't always want, or need, a full time office space to fulfill their work duties. This new type of office worker is redefining the workplace with a new set of needs, behaviors, and values. The NEXT project required a space designed to attract these contingent workers (independent freelancers, contractors, and 'solopreneurs') by giving them a place to come together in a co-working environment.
